



A 25 x11 ft deck overlooks an intimate lawn and exquisite gardens. The flag-shaped lot includes an unused narrow driveway that opens onto N East Street behind the corner house next door.



Another gathering space is the area under the deck, with a porch swing, that is on grade with the lower level that could be an in-law suite opening into the nicely landscaped back yard.



The bright open master suite encompasses the entire upper level with neat nooks and 2 walk-in closets.



The recently updated master bath features a tile floor and additional storage space.



The lower level could be an apartment or in-law suite with 2 bedrooms, a full bath, an office/studio that could be converted back into an 2nd eat-in kitchen. An additional 330 sqft unfinished room is a workshop.



The Oakwood Common is a play area for toddlers. Canines can play at the nearby Oakwood Dog Park. Oakwood events include spring jazz brunch, 4th of July picnic, Candlelight Tour and monthly pot-luck suppers.



The Historic Oakwood neighborhood is an eclectic urban village seamlessly surrounded by unique urban neighbors pictured below. The value of property in Oakwood is increased by its status as a local Historic District, the first in NC.



Walking through the nearby Oakwood Cemetery is walking back through history. The rolling field just inside the gate is the site of picnics and winter-time sledding.
