## **Features**



Carefully restored Gothic - Queen Anne style


The original features include three gothic windows, lots of stained glass, the 'gingerbread' on the front porch and the 'fishscale' sawnwork on the gables. The small peaked roof structure at the back, now part of the house, had originally been a detached kitchen. The new roof has architectural shingles.



A narrow grassy driveway leads back to the large daylight basement that has several rooms with concrete floors. Recently added custom doors are big enough to build and/or store a boat. Other possible uses include studio, potting shed and exercise room.




The light at the end of the long central hall with its graceful arch is this bright sun room addition that is adjacent to the remodeled kitchen (below).

Each of the 3 bedrooms could be used as a den, parlor, study or office. All are larger than 15'x15' but two lack closets, characteristic of the 1890's. In lieu of adding closets when restored, the original doors between rooms were left intact so that the rooms can flexibly used. The larger of the 2 bathrooms (below left) includes a walk-in closet. The other bath recently was completely redone with tile floor and quality fixtures.
