

Walk everywhere

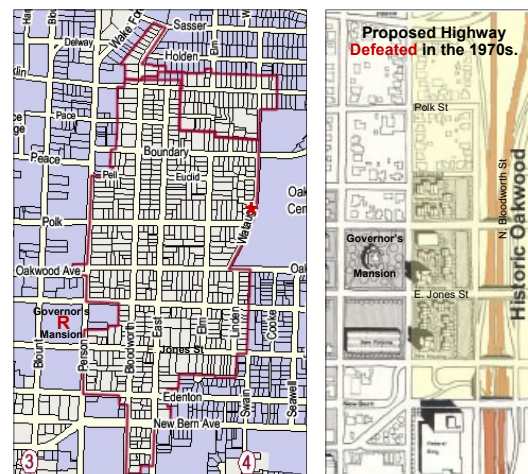

The value of property in Oakwood is increased by the fact that it is a historic district. Overlapping local and national Oakwood historic districts are shown in the map "below left".
